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Annual Risk Control Grant Program Details

Beginning 1/1/20, the Delaware Valley Workers' Compensation Trust (DVWCT) and Delaware Valley Property & Liability Trust (DVPLT) Executive Committees approved a new risk control grant program as a value-added member benefit. Unused grant balances will now be rolled over each year without a maximum for members in good standing. These grants provide extra-budgetary funds for initiatives which reduce the frequency/severity of injuries/illnesses or property/liability losses.

Examples of investments eligible for DVWCT grant funding:

- Automated external defibrillators (AEDs)
- Audio visual equipment to facilitate employee safety training
- Baseline and periodic physicals/cancer screening for covered employees
- Building emergency notification/evacuation/lighting systems
- Cameras for municipal vehicles to minimize collisions
- Concrete saws or low-vibration concrete breakers to replace jack hammers
- Confined space entry equipment such as atmosphere monitoring equipment, tripods, ventilation blowers
- Hepatitis B vaccinations for employees with occupational exposures
- Hydraulic cart tippers and collection arms to replace manual refuse collection
- Sound level meters
- PPE such as anti-vibration gloves, body armor, chain saw chaps, hard hats, hearing protection, high visibility reflective traffic safety apparel, traction footwear and respiratory protection
- Powered lift gates to facilitate handling of oversized equipment or refuse
- Remediation of hazardous walking surfaces (e.g., milling or slab jacking)
- Replacement of obsolete tools/equipment such as grinders, table saws and chippers which do not meet modern equipment safety standards
- Roll-over protection systems for mobile equipment
- Trench shield and shoring equipment to prevent trench collapse

Examples of investments eligible for DVPLT grant funding:

- Automated fire suppression systems
- Building perimeter access control/theft deterrent and surveillance systems
- Cameras for municipal vehicles to minimize collisions
- Computer firewall and security software to prevent electronic theft
- Flammable liquid storage cabinets and containers
- GPS fleet management systems
- Playground fall attenuation surfacing (playground mulch and unitary safety surfacing)
- Remediation of hazardous walking surfaces (e.g., milling or slab jacking)
- Replacement of non-compliant/unsafe playground equipment and non-CPSC compliant bleachers
- Sewer line video imaging equipment
- Mobile video recording equipment such as in-car and body-worn cameras
- Temporary traffic control devices such as signs, cones, barricades and variable message boards
- Tuition for playground maintenance or playground safety inspector course

The value of each grant is set annually by DVT's underwriter based on the premium contribution of each member. To apply for the grant, members should complete the attached application form. The form should be returned to the Risk Control Department at the address specified on the form.

Risk control grant fund allocations will become available for reimbursement on January 1st of each year (provided they are approved by the respective Executive Committees). Any unused grant funds remaining on December 31 will be added to subsequent program allocations. Turnaround time to process an application or reimbursement request is approximately 5-10 working days. Applicants will be notified of their approval status along with their remaining grant balance via email.

Upon approval, grantees must provide proof of purchase and payment (copy of invoice and cancelled payment check or credit card receipt). Each Trust will issue a reimbursement check up to the maximum value of the grant. If necessary, the Trust can pay vendors directly if provided with an invoice and a W-9 form. If the grant application is incomplete, members will have an opportunity to make corrections. All decisions regarding the eligibility of proposed items are final.
